



STARTING MONDAY MORNING MEETINGS IN OUR AUDITORIUM NEXT MONDAY!

**Great News!** It is with great joy that we announce that our new school counselor is Ms. Paulina Cuevas. Paulina went to Chile this week and visa renewal was approved. She is now officially our QAE school counselor! Once she receives her visa documents, she will return to Seattle and begin at QAE. She will be on site Monday's to Thursday's.

In addition to being a certified K - 12 counselor, Paulina is also a certified Positive Discipline trainer. She has her graduate certificate in LGBT Health Policy and Practices. She has been a school counselor, worked for Positive Discipline in Seattle and has been working in China for the





Paulina's hire was only possible due to PTSA funding. PTSA increased our counselor position from 0.6 to 0.8 this year, which is a significant increase financially. Staff and I are so grateful to PTSA for their commitment to having outstanding educators working with our children. Thank you to the QAE Hiring Team, PTSA Board, SPS HR and Paulina for all the hard work that went into the visa renewal process. This was a team effort!

**Ready Math:** New 2<sup>nd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> Grade Math Curriculum at QAE! Thank you PTSA for funding our brand-new Ready Math curriculum and iReady assessment tool for all 2<sup>nd</sup> – 5<sup>th</sup> grade students. We are one of only two SPS schools piloting this dynamic, differentiated, research-based curriculum. All 2<sup>nd</sup> – 5<sup>th</sup> grade teachers took Ready Math training before school started, the resources arrived in time for the first day of school and we are so excited to have these new resources to make a difference for our students' mathematical understanding. PTSA paid for additional professional development to take place throughout the year. QAE parents can look forward to weekly updates on what the class is working on and what families can try at home (games, recipes, etc.) to increase real world practice of the math concepts being taught. **Curriculum Night:** Thursday 9/27/18 6:30 - 8:00 pm at John Marshall: For new QAE families, Curriculum Night is an annual SPS evening information session for parents. This year, QAE parents/guardians will begin in the John Marshall auditorium/cafeteria at 6:30pm for staff introductions and an overview of our five pillars and QAE foundational elements, such as Project Based Learning (PBL), social emotional learning and innovative technology. Then parents/guardians will move to your child's classroom where your child's teacher will provide a presentation from the grade group team on academic programs, social emotional learning and supporting your child at home.

We begin in the John Marshall auditorium/cafeteria at 6:30 pm for staff introductions and an overview of QAE pillars. A 20-minute presentation will be offered by each classroom teacher in their room at 7 pm and repeated at 7:30pm to accommodate families with more than one child. Beginning at 7:30 pm, Janine Roy will be available in the cafeteria to answer any remaining questions.

**Bussing Update:** I feel like our community has climbed a mountain as we relocated and settled in to our new building. Our unexpected challenge of significant bus delays has given us a new mountain to climb together. I so appreciate all QAE parents collaboratively tackling this next challenge together. Your ideas, suggestions, volunteering, and helpful coordination are all greatly appreciated! Thanks to everyone's hard work, it has improved since the beginning of the year. But it is not smooth sailing yet! Thank you QAE parents for your creative problem-solving as we tackled our bussing challenges together. By the end of this week, SPS Transportation was regularly updating the school and parents through robo-calls, which allows QAE to communicate updates to families by emails. Parents have been fantastic coordinating drop-offs and pick-ups. SPS reports that they have 50 drivers in training and are hiring for 40 additional driver positions.
